

PayPal Tips

We prefer to use PayPal on our websites for several reasons. It is secure, it doesn't store your financial information and it makes it easy to issue refunds.

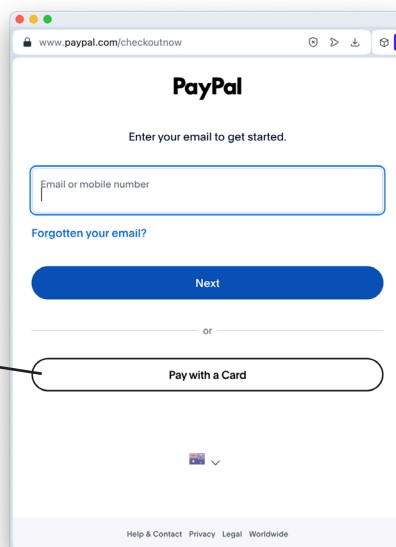
PayPal has improved its interface recently, but you may find this guide helpful to navigate the process.

The PayPal "Buy Now" button looks like this:




The easiest process is to click on the "PayPal Buy Now" button. This will take you to the PayPal site through a popup window.

If you want to pay with a credit or debit card, just click on the "Pay with a Card" button.




This will take you to the next screen.

This is a normal credit card form, so you can enter your credit card details as usual.

But before you do this, scroll down to the bottom of the window.

Notice this "toggle" near the bottom. If you leave it in the On position it will assume you want to create a new PayPal account - since you probably do not want this, just click to turn it off.
